

OBITUARIES

HILARY KATHRYN CLULOW FGSM, AGSM

15th August 1944 - 27th October 2019

Hilary was passionate about Speech and Drama from a very early age and studied with Peggy Batchelor at Ridley Studios in Leigh. She was a regular performer at the local Festivals and won numerous awards for her efforts. Later, she would enter her own pupils of all ages, encouraging them to experiment with the thrill of performance. When graduating from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, she was also awarded the year prizes for Direction and Public Speaking. She certainly never looked back. Her early involvement with the profession included acting, directing and touring as Company Manager. Many a successful actor was set on their way after working with her when she was Director of Watford Theatre in Education. She was the youngest ever examiner appointed by the Guildhall and was later honoured to be awarded the FGSM for her services to Speech and Drama education. As a member of the British and International Federation of Adjudicators, she worked extensively at Festivals throughout the UK and abroad. She was a regular at the Hong Kong Festival and developed a love for the country and its people.

A dynamic teacher, she helped to shape many young people's lives and she remained passionate about her work throughout her life. She was a very popular and talented adjudicator and the family have been overwhelmed with tributes from her colleagues, Festival representatives and past pupils. Her sister, Viv Cunningham, described her as talented, kind and inspirational. Hilary will be missed by us all.

DAPHNE JUNE ROWLAND

20th May 1927 - 30th September 2019

Daphne was born in Kensington London and first began to learn the piano at the age of six and developed into talented musician. At one point in her musical studies her teacher was Ippolit Mochaloff, the tutor of the Tsar's imperial Romanov family in Russia, who had fled his homeland during the Russian Revolution. Daphne became a concert pianist and won many awards. Amongst her accolades she won the Chopin Cup at Wigmore Hall and they became very good friends before he married Greta Garbo.

Also, at this time became a life long friend and pen pal to the famous singer and actress Deanna Durbin, which lasted until Deanna died.

She married Reginald Rowland and had two sons, Ian and Peter. Daphne began teaching piano and singing, very successfully with an abundance of pupils who would become successful musicians and singers in the entertainment business. She often performed at many distinguished functions with her husband who played the drums. They became a very successful duo with many gigs under their belt. As a wife, mother and nana she was a loving, kind, positive person who loved animals and had a good sense of humour. At the age of 92 she was still teaching on the Thursday before she passed in the early hours on the following Monday September 30th 2019.

Our records show that Daphne became involved with our festival in 1975 and was for many years on the piano committee of festival and attended her last meeting in January 2018. Always smiling and keen to play when choosing the set pieces. Over the years she put in many pupils to play at the festival, and also has a duet cup named after her. She will be dearly missed and we thank her for her outstanding service in enriching the musical community of Southend on Sea and for all the support she gave to our festival.

ROY ALBERT BAILEY

15th August 1942 - 23rd January 2020

As proprietor of The Cambridge Press, Roy provided great support to the Southend Musical Festival over many years, controlling not only the printing of much of the general stationery but also the production of the annual Syllabus, Programme and Certificates awarded to each competitor. Indeed, in spite of a very busy schedule, Roy was always mindful of the tight deadlines for Festival publications and worked very hard to ensure that the first 100 copies of the Syllabus and the Programme were available well ahead of time.

Roy's father, Mr A J Bailey, had taken over The Cambridge Press in April, 1950 and Roy joined the business immediately upon leaving school in 1957. It was in 1962 that the Festival began its association with Roy and a year later Cambridge Press moved to new premises at 20, High Street, Shoeburyness. There they remained until Roy's retirement in January, 2010, in recognition of which he donated The Cambridge Press Trophy for Piano Playing.

Even after his retirement, Roy was happy to stay in contact with the Festival and for a number of years was, together with his wife Pearl, regularly to be seen enjoying both the Piano Section classes and the Prize Winners' Concert.

NOEL CHRISTOPHER KELLEWAY

26th December 1951 - 3rd March 2020

Noel's involvement with the Festival was mainly acting in support of his wife, Sheila, in her long-standing role as Woodwind & Brass Secretary (and Vice Chairman to Sally Browne for many years). He was immensely proud of his family and took particular pleasure in attending the choir classes, where both Sheila and daughter Sarah, sang in Cantare. We will very much miss seeing him at the Festival and are extremely grateful for his contribution and encouragement.

PREFACE

The 2019 Festival...

It seems such a long time ago now but as there was no Syllabus produced last year, we have not had the opportunity to make any comments on what was a very successful and enjoyable Festival in 2019. This year saw many changes, including a brand-new on-line entry system which proved to be very beneficial to all. We are, as always very grateful to those who either support individual classes or who contribute on a more general basis towards our running costs. In particular, we should acknowledge Alfred Music for their continued sponsorship of the Piano section and Mr Peter Parsons for his ongoing contribution to the Prize Fund.

The 2020 Festival that never was....

Sadly, due to the Coronavirus pandemic, we were unable to hold our Festival in 2020. We made the decision early on to cancel, which turned out to be the right thing to do given the repeated nationwide lockdowns we have all had to endure. However, just because there was no Festival in November, it does not mean that we have sat around doing nothing! A huge amount of administrative re-organising has been taking place and an exciting new website is being launched in June.

The 2021 Festival

The Executive Committee are hopeful that this year's Festival will be able to run as usual from Friday 5th to Saturday 20th November. Once again, we will be holding the Festival at the Kings Road United Reformed Church, together with The Cunningham Theatre at Thorpe Hall School, which will host some of the Speech and Drama classes. However, we are acutely aware that things could change over the next six months and we are therefore making contingency plans to hold an on-line event of some kind, should this become necessary.

A few new classes have been introduced this year including several non-competitive classes. Our hope is that this will give people the opportunity to perform pieces that they wish to just 'try out', or to give others, who have never performed before, the chance to stand up in front of an audience and see what happens!

As always, we have a fantastic panel of adjudicators from the British & International Federation of Festivals.

Since the 2019 Festival, we have held two AGMs and the Executive Committee have had to say goodbye to several of its members. We would like to give special thanks to the following people, who have stood down after many years of dedicated commitment to the running of the Festival: Penny Kidgell (Piano Secretary), Kathryn Ash (Strings and Minutes Secretary), Sarah Chin-a-Loy (Safeguarding Officer) and especially Ann Holland who was our very supportive Chairman for 6 years. This inevitably means that there are some new people to say hello to: Verina Weaver (Piano Secretary), Marylisa Browne (Minutes Secretary) and Megan Jenkins (Safeguarding Officer). There has also been some major switching of roles within the committee itself. I am your new Chairman; Tim Browne is the Vice Chairman and Nalan Jolly has stood down from her role as Honorary General Secretary. Nalan is now our Publicity Officer, whilst Joanna Masters, our Friends and Members Secretary has also taken on the role of Honorary General Secretary. Joanna has been ably assisting Nalan over the past year and we are extremely grateful to both ladies for their continued dedication to our wonderful organisation and look forward to working with them long into the future.

Finally, some very exciting news. The Festival has been without a President for the past few years and I am delighted to be able to say that this situation has now been remedied. We are thrilled to announce that the actor and singer, Lee Mead has agreed to become our President and we are all very excited about what he will bring to our Association. Lee competed in our Festival as a youngster and he is honoured to have been asked to take up this position. We all look forward to seeing Lee in November.

WELCOME TO OUR NEW PRESIDENT.....

LEE MEAD shot to prominence after winning the BBC series 'Any Dream Will Do' to take the role of Joseph in the West End in 2007. In June 2007 he released 'Any Dream Will Do' and 'Close Every Door'. The songs entered the UK Singles Download Charts and peaked at No 2. Lee released his first album 'Lee Mead' in 2007 and his second album 'Nothing Else Matters' in 2009.

Lee returned to the West End in 2010 to take on the role of Fyero in the musical 'Wicked' to critical acclaim. He continued to pursue his solo singing career, taking his own show 'An Evening with Lee Mead' around the UK. He also starred in his own Christmas show at the London Coliseum in December 2010. Lee continued to tour the UK with his band throughout 2011 and in the same year played the lead male role, Emmett Forrest in the smash hit musical 'Legally Blonde' at the Savoy Theatre in London's West End. The end of 2011 saw Lee touring his own sell out show in Japan with the National Polish Orchestra.

He joined the cast of BBC 'Casualty' as Nurse Ben 'Lofty' Chiltern in 2013, a role which was specifically created for him and which has proved a huge success for Lee and for the show. Despite being incredibly busy at the BBC, and in pantomime each Christmas and New Year, Lee found time to perform in his own concerts during 2014. He also returned to the West End's legendary Garrick Theatre in December 2014 and 2015 with his own Christmas shows.

Lee took a 12-month leave of absence from 'Casualty' to take on the role of Caractacus Potts in a new touring production of 'Chitty Chitty Bang Bang' from May-September 2016. He released his fourth album 'Some Enchanted Evening', which went into the Top 20 in February 2016 and toured with his own show of the same name throughout 2015/2016.

In December 2016 and January 2017 Lee was offered the opportunity to appear in pantomime at the legendary London Palladium with the world's biggest pantomime producers, Qdos. He performed in 'Cinderella' as Prince Charming, alongside Julian Clary and Paul O'Grady, to great acclaim.

In May 2017, Lee was invited to join the cast of the BBC hit TV show, 'Holby City', to reprise the role of Ben 'Lofty' Chiltern. Lee remained at 'Holby City' for three years as a weekly favourite among fans of the show, attracting an audience of 5 million viewers each week.

In 2018, Lee headlined the "Stages Cruise Festival" with Michael Ball and appeared on stage with Don Black. Later that year Lee performed at the composer's 80th birthday celebration 'An Evening with Don Black' which aired on BBC Radio 2.

Recently, Lee fulfilled one of his childhood ambitions by performing in front of the entire Royal Family at the Royal Albert Hall 'Festival of Remembrance Concert' alongside James Blunt, Leona Lewis and Rick Astley.

During his career to date, Lee has duetted with some of the world's most popular artists, including Josh Groban, Susan Boyle and Donny Osmond to name a few.

Not many may know that Lee is from Southend and was part of what was once the Focus Youth Theatre. As a previous competitor, he is honoured to be the President of the Southend Musical Festival. Lee's goals are to encourage more people into the Arts as a way of developing creativity and confidence, as well as growing the profile of the Festival in the town as a celebration of the local performing arts scene.

ADJUDICATORS

SINGING: Yvonne Patrick, GRNCM, ALCM

Yvonne Patrick studied at the Royal Northern College of Music and began her professional career with D'Oyly Carte Opera Company performing numerous roles including Elsie Yeomen of the Guard and Josephine HMS Pinafore. She joined Glyndebourne Festival Opera in 1994 and made her Festival debut in 1998. She made her Glyndebourne Touring Opera debut in the role of Despina Cosi fan tutte and in their production of The Bartered Bride she sang the role of Esmeralda which included training to be a trapeze artist! For Opera North she sang Musetta La Boheme. She has also worked for Welsh National Opera, Garsington Opera, Kentish Opera, Carl Rosa Opera Company, Swansea City Opera, Garden Opera, Opera Box and Opera Brava. Roles performed include Violetta, La Traviata, Fiordiligi Cosi fan tutte, Micaela Carmen, Pamina and First Lady, The Magic Flute, Donna Elvira Don Giovanni, Clorinda La Cenerentola, Cio cio san Madame Butterfly, Mimi La Boheme and Rosalinda and Adele Die Fledermaus. On a tour of Kenya, she was the soprano soloist in a performance of Mozart's Requiem in Nairobi Cathedral. As a well-known performer of Gilbert and Sullivan, she was invited to appear as soprano soloist in the Centenary Gala Concert of the Philadelphia Savoy Company, the oldest Gilbert and Sullivan society in America. Yvonne is a regular guest performer on cruises and has also appeared on BBC Radio 2's Friday Night is Music Night.

Yvonne has worked extensively for the education departments of the major opera companies in the UK. Alongside her busy performing career, she is an adjudicator with the British Music Festival Federation, teaches privately, and is an Associate Lecturer at Chichester University and Lancing College in West Sussex. In 2018, Yvonne, with friend and colleague Louise Crane, set up Sussex School of Song in Shoreham-by-Sea, running weekend courses for young singers at the beginning of their career and amateur soloists, working with experienced professional singers and accompanists. Yvonne is also a keen runner completing three Brighton Marathons and recently the Great North Run. She shares her home with husband Tim and two rescue cats – Bonnie and Clyde!

PIANOFORTE: Timothy Barratt, ARAM, GRSM, LRAM, ARCM, LMusTCL

Timothy Barratt studied on a Scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music, winning many major awards, and completed his studies with Vlado Perlemuter in Paris and Geoffrey Parsons. He has toured and broadcast extensively in the UK and abroad as soloist, accompanist and chamber music player. Whilst still a student he developed a special interest in song accompaniment through playing for Masterclasses at Aldeburgh, subsequently partnering such artists as Dame Felicity Lott and Robert White. In addition, instrumentalists he has worked with include Jack Brymer, Bradley Creswick and Haaken Hardenberger. Teaching forms a major part of his musical life and he works with pupils of all ages and levels from beginner to post-graduate. He was Head of Keyboard at Dulwich College for almost 25 years whilst also teaching at the RAM and TCM and now pursues a busy freelance career.

An ABRSM examiner since 1991, he is also a Trainer, Moderator and Mentor. Other work for the AB includes selecting the graded Piano pieces and presenting Seminars. He frequently directs Masterclasses for performers and teachers' workshops in the UK and Far East and is in demand as a Competition and Festival adjudicator.

WOODWIND AND BRASS - Philip Dewhurst BA(Hons), PGCE FISM

Philip Dewhurst was born and educated in Bolton, Lancashire. He read music at the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne under Professor Denis Matthews where he specialised in performance on the oboe. After finishing his degree, he completed a Post Graduate Certificate of Education and pursued a career in teaching. Philip has held several posts as Director of Music in prestigious independent schools in the North West most recently at Cheadle Hulme School, Cheshire from where he has recently retired. Philip gives occasional recitals and enjoys orchestral and chamber music playing on a freelance basis. He has a passion for choral music and has conducted and directed choirs & choral societies throughout his career as well as being musical director for many musicals and shows. As well as adjudicating at music festivals around the country, Philip is an examiner for Trinity College London and an experienced GCSE and A level moderator.

STRINGS – Iona Zuiderwijk

Iona was born in Liverpool and began playing the violin under teacher Peter Mountain. She was a pupil at Chethams and Wells Cathedral school before going to the Royal Academy of Music to study violin with Molly Mack and Ralph Holmes and she also studied the harpsichord. After a career in playing, she diverted into a career in social work and probation, qualifying and working in various settings. Studying violin with Howard Davis during this time, Iona reverted to a career in music, becoming a Head of Strings for Oakham, Guernsey Music Service, Birkdale and Kimbolton schools as well as later a head of music. She became a coach for the National Children's Orchestra. Her Fiddlefingers project in Sheffield, offering tuition in violin and cello for local five-year olds, won through twice to the finals in the Music for Youth competition festival. Iona was trained by Sheila Nelson in the teaching of technique to young children whilst making it fun.

lona is an examiner for Trinity College and offers training for primary music teachers in using Kodaly and eurythmics as well as string workshops for violin/viola teachers in establishing good technique from the start. Home, once more, is Liverpool.

SPEECH AND DRAMA - Vivienne Redford, LLAM, MSTSD(Adj)

Vivienne has studied Speech & Drama since the age of four and has been teaching the subject since 1980. She is the Head of Speech and Drama at a large independent girls' school in Bedford. She is also the Principal of the Redford School of Speech and Drama, established in 1982, training children and adults of all ages in all aspects of the performing arts and communication. Many of her former students perform in TV, film and theatre around the world and in major West End productions, the Globe, the RSC and the National Theatre. Others are pursuing careers as teachers of Speech and Drama, Theatre Directors and Technicians.

Vivienne has produced and directed a diverse range of musical and theatrical productions and particularly enjoys writing and devising original and creative theatre with her senior students. For the past nineteen years, she has organised and directed a widely-acclaimed summer school for students aged 7 to 21, which culminates in a commissioned play, written for and performed by the students who attend.

Vivienne is an examiner for the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art, a member of the Society of Teachers of Speech and Drama and an Adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals travelling extensively throughout the UK, Ireland and the Channel Islands. She is a former secretary and now a Vice-President of the Bedfordshire Festival of Music, Speech and Drama which has given her a clear understanding and insight into the work, energy and commitment that Festival organisers, teachers and pupils put into making their Festivals a success.

When not working (which is a rare occurrence) Vivienne enjoys: seeing as much theatre as possible, reading, particularly children's books, cooking and relishes spending time with her family.

2. Child Protection Policy

The Festival's Child Protection Policy and our approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, our Programme and on our website. This includes the very latest best practice recommendations from the British and International Federation of Festivals working in partnership with the NSPCC and Children England under the SafeNetwork banner.

3. Festival Policy on the use of Cameras and Video/Audio Recording Equipment

Please note that we do <u>NOT</u> allow cameras, video recorders or audio recorders in the Performance Hall; the presence of such equipment would make it impossible for the Festival to guarantee adherence to the following rulings:

- (i) <u>Child Protection</u>: the permission of the parent or guardian of every child under 18, or vulnerable adult of any age, must be obtained if a photograph or recording is made of that child/vulnerable adult;
- (ii) <u>Copyright</u>: every person recording would have to have an appropriate current licence from the Mechanical Copyright Protection Society this licence would have to be checked by the Festival on the day; every person recording must have the permission of the owner of the venue and of ALL performers; adjudicators' words are copyright and written permission must be obtained before they can be reproduced; the Festival is always responsible for upholding copyright and would therefore be ultimately liable for any breach.

In addition to the above, the use of cameras and/or recording equipment can be **disruptive** and off-putting for the competitors, to the detriment of their performance – a significant amount of hard work will have gone into their preparation for this performance and it is only fair to them that we do everything to ensure that we provide the best possible platform for them on the day.

4. <u>Time Limits</u>

Must be strictly observed to avoid losing marks; Competitors are reminded that spoken introductions count towards their use of the time limit.

5. Adjudicator Copies of Own Choice Pieces

Competitors are reminded of the importance of providing a copy of their <u>own choice</u> piece(s) for the Adjudicator. The copy(ies) should be brought to the Festival and handed in at the appropriate time (with the exception of own composition pieces, which should be submitted in advance, according to the instructions in the Syllabus). <u>Failure to provide an Adjudicator's copy</u> may result in a loss of marks; there are only limited photocopying facilities at the Festival itself.

6. Scheduling of Classes

The Festival makes efforts to schedule classes outside of school hours for those of secondary school age. We would like to stress, however, that visits to the Festival are widely acknowledged to be valuable educational experiences and would encourage those in a position to grant leave of absence from school to regard them as such. The Festival's links with the local Music Hub, together with its designation as a Learning Destination under the auspices of the new Children's University scheme, provide further and substantial evidence of the educational nature attributed to the Festival.

GENERAL CONDITIONS for COMPETITION

- 1. The Competitions are intended for amateurs except where marked "Amateur or Professional". A person is regarded as "Professional" if their main income is derived from performing or teaching within the Section concerned. Conductors and accompanists may, of course, be professional musicians.
- 2. No competitor may enter a class to be judged by an adjudicator from whom he or she has received private tuition in the twelve months prior to the Festival.
- 3. **OWN CHOICE** titles, composers, authors and publishers etc. **must be given** on the entry form. Competitors failing to give this information, or offering a different piece on the day, will be adjudicated, but not marked. A copy of own choice must be provided for the adjudicator at the time of the performance failure to do so may result in a loss of marks. Competitors may not perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 4. No recorded accompaniments are to be used.
- 5. **COSTUMES** are **NOT PERMITTED** in any Festival classes, unless otherwise stated.
- 6. TIME LIMITS must be strictly observed to avoid losing marks; competitors are reminded that spoken introductions count towards their use of the time limit.
- 7. The Festival may, at its discretion, decide to amalgamate classes.
- 8. **At the end of each class, trophies, prizes and medals** will be awarded and Certificates and Evaluation Sheets distributed.

Please do not contact them until you know the time and date of your classes. There is no obligation to use one of these accompanists; you may arrange to use an accompanist not listed here.

11. NOTES

- i) Where "age" is pertinent to determining the appropriate class/fee, this is the age of the competitor(s) as at 31st AUGUST immediately preceding the Festival (any exceptions to this general rule will be stated against individual classes).
- ii) NOVICE CLASSES competitors must not have been learning for more than the time specified for the class entered.

Parents/guardians/carers/teachers of entrants under 18 and/or vulnerable adults of any age must make themselves aware of the Festival's Child Protection Policy and our approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone (at end of Syllabus).

Southend Musical Festival complies with the principles embodied in the Data Protection Act which is the UK's implementation of General Data Protection Regulation. Information submitted on entry forms will be processed on a computer system, held securely and used only by authorised personnel, solely for the purposes of Festival administration; it will never be shared with any third parties. Names are printed in the Festival programme and results are shown on the Festival website. All records are destroyed three months after the completion of the Festival. ALL CLASSES ARE OPEN TO COMPETITORS FROM ANY DISTRICT

The Music Publishers Association has recently issued a revised code of practice on copying copyright works: "When an Own Choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works and which is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of an adjudicator at a competition or festival provided that the competitor or participant has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed immediately after the event. The accompanist should always be given a printed copy."

COPIES OF OWN CHOICE <u>must</u> be provided for the Adjudicator (failure to do so may result in a loss of marks). Songs may not be used in more than one class.

TIME LIMITS must be strictly observed; candidates are reminded that spoken introductions count towards their use of the time limit.

Please note that PROMPTING from the audience is not allowed under any circumstances. Competitors are expected to sing from memory, with the exception of Oratorio and Sing & Play (classes 20, 24 & 37).

Costumes and recorded accompaniments ARE NOT PERMITTED.

Child Protection Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech works for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to create Safer Festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival.

- 3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection leaflets, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers, including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new Festival staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival stewards wear a ribbon with a name badge and the committee member in charge of each session will wear an identifying red ribbon. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival ribbon and name badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition each Festival will ensure the availability of a guiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of the Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils/vulnerable adults. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils/vulnerable adults are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, performance, practice and changing areas that may be provided.
- 7. No unauthorised photography or video recording is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child/pupil/vulnerable adult is not included in official authorised photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever possible to meet these needs, but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and on our website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.
